




Shooting stars






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Rainbows

In December Rockets Class have enjoyed some wintery, Christmas themed music. We have played our instruments, with our pretend snow and snowballs. We love to dance and sing!
























Comets
















The class favorite was biscoff biscuit spread closely followed by marmite.



During this half term we have been getting out and about as an ASDAN community participation module. The pupils really like going on the bus! If we can't get on the bus we experience life skills at school.






































Students have been sorting items into groups and sequencing colours, shapes and numbers to gain their ASDAN qualification in Early Maths- Sorting and Sequencing.









Working towards ASDAN qualifications

Students in 14 – 19 stage continue work towards ASDAN qualifications. Many activities within the school day support accreditation along with specifically planned lessons. We also regularly visit our local community to practice and gain a range of skills.

Trips to local shops, colleges or other community facilities give opportunity for students to demonstrate how they get on with others, such as unfamiliar staff they meet. Asdan unit 'Getting on with other people' is a citizenship qualification where skills such as listening, responding, following instructions and accepting help are practiced.
