In Reading, pupils have engaged with the story Dear Zoo, listening and exploring props in the immersive classroom, as well as matching animals from the story with symbols and pictures.




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Rainbows










MOONBEAMS






Mars





Pupils have listened to different pieces of classical music, had a go on some of the instruments and taken turns to conduct the musicians.











Shredding, delivering memos and refilling leaflet stands at Touchwood.

















Year 10 – 14 students



Students new to 14 – 19 stage and ASDAN Qualifications Welcome to 5 students who have joined our 14-19 stage where they will start to build up credits towards ASDAN qualifications awarded when leaving school. This year there are 21 students in years 10 to 14 working across locations at either main site or satellite centre in Green Lane.





Some students are supported to use PECS (Picture exchange communication system) to make choices and communicate personal preferences. Information gained can be used towards asdan ' Developing independent living skills: having your say'.

GOOD JOB!

Students practice chopping and cutting skills for lunch time at the satellite centre. The use of appropriate equipment and techniques is part of student learning in asdan unit 'Developing skills for the workplace: health and safety'.



Our 14-19 curriculum identifies skills we want students to learn then matches to qualifications available within ASDAN programmes at Entry 1, 2 or 3. This means students leave school with qualifications to prove skills mastered. Good for confidence and well-being as well as useful if moving on to other settings offering further qualifications.



A big thank you to everyone who attended the Transition Information Evening for Parents of pupils in Years 8-14 on 6th October. More parents attended than ever before, which was great. We hope everyone got the information they needed but should you need any further advice or help, please contact Janine, our Transition Family Support Worker via the support dojo.
