



Rainbows




Rainbows class have been busy in our science lessons this half term. We have had sensory explorations of materials relating to the environment. We have looked at ice, snow, water and sand!

Well done, Rainbows!



















In 'My Learning' sessions Moonbeams have been exploring measurement.
















Rockets

In the Spring term we learned about size, big and small, and tall and short. We took part in different activities. We matched big and small geometric shapes and objects

























In 'My Future' educational visits we have continued to focus on developing our life skills outside of the classroom.


Children's Health and Mental Provision support
