





Message from Miss Brettell





This will be my first newsletter as the Head Teacher and although we have only been back at school for just over 6 weeks, when I reflect on this half term, the staff and pupils have been very busy indeed as you will see throughout this newsletter. Across the school, pupils have been engaged in a range of exciting learning activities and opportunities such as CBSO visits, horse riding, college visits and educational visits to lots of exciting places. Every pupil in the school has achieved and made progress in a variety of ways and it has been a joy to celebrate their success and achievements with them.


After Easter we will be welcoming a new member of staff to Mercury Class. In the meantime, Miss Katrina and Miss Alexa will be overseeing all the hard work that goes on in Mercury and have lots of exciting topics and activities planned.

I have been spending time looking at our school's current staffing structure. As a school we have grown considerably in numbers over the years and need to ensure we can support pupils to have the best quality education. My findings have informed the decision to have a staff restructure, allowing for pupil's to have greater opportunities, achievement and also supporting staff development. I will be sharing more information with you in the Easter term.

I have also been looking at the school building and in the forthcoming months we are looking to carry out projects to enhance our school building for our pupils. The first exciting news is We have a sensory room which many of you will be familiar with, it has both a dark and white room and has been in use for at least 15 years. When it was installed, it was a state of the art sensory room but over time and being used every day, it has become very tired and like all antiques, it needed a lot of loving care to keep it going. So it has undergone a redesign and after half term the Sensory room will become an immersive classroom. What is an immersive classroom you may ask?

The immersive classroom will bring the real world into school through a fully immersive environment using wind, smoke, sound and visuals. This fantastic resource will allow teachers to take their pupils beyond the classroom and the walls of the school into experiences that they may not otherwise ordinarily encounter.

We can transport our pupils to anywhere: outer space, an adventure into the deepest, darkest woods or an environment that needs to be soothing or stimulating. The space can be adapted to suit the individual needs of pupils. By controlling elements such as temperature and lighting, we create experiences that will enhance our pupil's learning needs through exploration.












Rainbows

Rainbows have enjoyed lots of turn taking games and activities with their peers this half term.














Rainbows have also enjoyed sharing lots of stories with their friends and classroom adults through story time, sensory story and choices time.











Rockets

We have been playing games and using the interactive whiteboard.
















We say 'my turn, your turn', as we encourage the children to take turns.

We worked on a variety of targets improving our visual skills and problem solving in maths and independent work. We used symbols to communicate our likes and needs in all activities.


We also regularly explored different materials in sensory messy play, which we love.
















Galaxies

hungry












Jupiter




This term Neptune Class have been enjoying their new reading corner in the link. They have been reading some of their favourite books and stories on their own or sharing a book with a friend by reading to each other.






Working towards ASDAN qualifications in 14-19 stage



Personal Progress unit 'Developing skills for the workplace: looking after and caring for animals' gives opportunity for students to be directly involved with daily care and safety routines for different animals and pets. This proves a good taster towards ideas for future vocational or positive alternatives to work activities they might enjoy. Students were delighted when staff bought in much loved pets for some to meet and help care for. School also recruited some feathered friends to help give additional practical experience.

A day after hatching, chicks moved to brooder box for students to clean out and give chicks food and water daily. There was great excitement as some students watched chicks hatch over a few hours. They discovered that chicks use a 'beak tooth', a hard lump on the end of their beak, to break out of the shell from the inside, a process is called pipping.

Our students also wanted to know what happened to the chickens after the 2-week project ended. A question we had looked into carefully with the project provider Livingeggs.co.uk. Please look at their web site for more information.
