



At Shooting Stars they also have a new outdoor play area and we are currently looking at plans to enhance the Satellite site outdoor space to offer further learning opportunities through a safe outdoor space with places for pupils to socialise and grow plants and vegetables. Hopefully some of our families will be able to make use of this site during weekends and holiday times, more information to follow.

I mentioned in the February newsletter I would be evaluating the current school staffing structure. Following my evaluation, I am delighted to announce that due to the growth of the school further opportunities for development are available. Therefore, the new staffing structure will incorporate four phase leaders joining the middle leadership team, the senior leadership team which will consist of two assistant head teachers, deputy head teacher, business manager and head teacher. This will enhance pupil opportunities and outcomes and provide an opportunity for staff to further develop their skills.

Following a 'big push' on pupil's learning environment this is now underway and It has been wonderful looking at the opportunities pupils have available to them this term in the form of the new curriculum. All pupils have taken part in a World Book Day, planting competition along with other local schools, had visits from the CBSO, Amber Trust, visits to the local stables, Touchwood, Newlands Bishop special visits from the police to name but a few. We are hoping to add Heart of England Farm to our providers for the Summer term so pupils can access further employability opportunities.

We have had great fun!


















We have been exploring different old and new artists and re-creating some of their famous pieces of artwork, by adding our own twist.

This half term, Venus class have been looking after our class caterpillars. We have been observing their growth and making sure they have enough food so that they can turn into butterflies where we will then release them.












Adventurer went to Tudor Grange for a cycle session. The pupils had so much fun racing around the track!






















Working towards ASDAN qualifications

Our 14-19 stage students continue working towards ASDAN qualifications with 14 students in year 11 and 14 in process of having final pieces of work assessed by teachers and moderated within school. Units from this group of students will be submitted to ASDAN external moderators next month selected from 125 units of work. External moderation verifies school assessments and ensures national consistency within qualifications.

Students in years 10, 12 and 13 have their work moderated within school next term in preparation for submission to ASDAN for external verification in year 11 or 14.



There have been some fantastic pieces of work completed this year within 14-19 stage. For ASDAN unit "Developing Reading Skills" some of year 14 students have written and illustrated a short story to read to their friends. We really enjoyed finding out about all the adventures in Connor's "Dan's worst Day", Vicki's "Lucy has a bath" and Charlottes "Michael and Jane have fun". Well done to all our fantastic 14-19 stage students.

Thank you to those families that attended our Easter Event, fun was had by all and the bouncy castle was a great hit! We hope to plan another event next half term so look out for details on Dojo.












